HAWAIIAN ISLANDS HUMPBACK WHALE NATIONAL MARINE SANCTUARY HOSTS LECTURE Maui's Manta Rays: Ambassadors of the Olowalu Reef

Learn about Hawai'i's largest population of manta rays residing in Maui waters. How can they be studied? What are the lessons learned? What are their threats? How can we protect and preserve their populations for all future generations to enjoy? With wingspans reaching over 22 ft across, these charismatic and graceful giants have touched the hearts and minds of people all over the world.

Dr. Mark Deakos obtained his Biology degree from the University of Waterloo. At the University of Hawai'i, he completed his master's degree studying humpback whale behavior and continued his graduate work by completing his doctoral degree with a focus on manta ray ecology. In 2004, Mark founded The Hawai'i Association for Marine Education and Research, a non-profit organization with the mission of better understanding and protecting Hawai'i's marine resources.
